### Dr Harry Oxer

Between 1958 and 1975 Dr Oxer was with the Royal Air Force. From 1962 to 1975, he was a consultant in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care. He retired at the rank of Wing Commander.

From 1976 to the present he has been with St John Ambulance Western Australia. In 1976 he was appointed as their first Medical Director of Ambulance in Australia and from 2002 as their Medical Consultant. Between 1975 and 1998 he was also Consultant Specialist in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care of Fremantle Hospital.

Dr Oxer is presently Senior Lecturer in the School of Medicine at the University of Western Australia, in the Department of Emergency Medicine. He has been involved in ambulance and pain management through St. John Ambulance and committees such as:

- Member of the Convention of Ambulance Authorities of Australia and New Zealand Medical Directors group, some time Chairman
- Member of the West Australian College of Surgeons Road Trauma Committee and the Committee of the Western Australian Branch of the Aviation Medical Society of Australia and New Zealand
- St John Ambulance, Western Australia, member of the State Executive Council
- Past Chairman of the National Australian Resuscitation Council
- Member and past Chairman of the National Education Committee of the Institute of Ambulance Officers (Australia) 1976-1979, now the Australian College of Ambulance Professionals

In the 2002 Australia Day Honours Dr Oxer received the Ambulance Service medal and in 2006 he was promoted to Knight of Grace in the Order of St John. He has MA Honours and MB.BChir. degrees from Cambridge University
